Medication adherence will be tracked through the use of Wisepill dispensers. Treatment adherence will also be assessed through self-report measures and by obtaining viral load and CD4 cell counts from participants' healthcare providers. Compensation: Individuals who get randomized to the Treatment group will get paid up to \$375 and individuals randomized to the control group will get paid up to \$230. There is no waitlist. This study is led by Dr. Conall O'Cleirigh (the Fenway Institute. Massachusetts General Hospital, and Harvard Medical School) and Dr. Trevor Hart (HIV Prevention Lab Director, Ryerson University and the University of Toronto).
