In this study, participants will be randomly assigned to receive 10 individual counselling sessions or 2 individual counselling sessions. Medication adherence will be tracked through the use of Wisepill dispensers. Compensation: Individuals who get randomized to the Treatment group will get paid up to \$375 and individuals randomized to the control group will get paid up to \$230. There is no waitlist. This study is led by Dr. Conall O'Cleirigh (the Fenway Institute, Massachusetts General Hospital, and Harvard Medical School) and Dr. Trevor Hart (HIV Prevention Lab Director, Ryerson University and the University of Toronto).
