Dr. Roberta Timothy takes a global intersectional human rights approach to social determinants of health affecting African/Black and Indigenous communities. She specializes in the areas of intersectionality and ethics in health; health and race; transnational African/Black and Indigenous health; and anti-oppression/anti-colonial approaches to mental health. Roberta has extensive teaching experience in universities, colleges, and in social service organizations and community settings. Her scholarship contributes to critical race theory by examining how factors such as indigeneity, gender identity, class, sexual orientation, disability, transgenerational connections, and historical and contemporary intersectional violence impact African/Black communities health. Her work is also focused on centering community resistance through innovative decolonizing health practices.
